Renton River Days returns

AS WE MOVE INTO SUMMER, activities and events are ramping up, including movies and concerts in our parks and the return of Renton River Days.

River Days, our annual family festival and community celebration, returns July 22 and 23. This year's theme is "On the Road Again." Several familiar River Days events and activities are back, plus some new additions.

Renton River Days

July 23, 4:30 p.m., Houser Street Bridge: launch of rubber ducks into Cedar River from Houser Way pedestrian bridge.

Water Quality Report online

DO YOU KNOW where Renton’s drinking water comes from? Or how many gallons Renton residents and businesses used in 2021? How about the best way to water your lawn or garden?

The answers and much more are in our 2022 Water Quality Report, available as a pdf or translatable webpage at rentonwa.gov/waterquality.

Produced by our Public Works Department, the annual report traces our water supply from the source to your house or business. It’s also your guide to water conservation.

You’ll learn the steps our Public Works Division has taken to comply with the Municipal Water Law and identify and correct leaks.

There are tips and strategies on building a beautiful, healthy lawn using minimal watering, how to protect salmon runs and available rebates through the city’s membership in the Saving Water Partnership.

Learn how to help save salmon runs, create a sustainable garden, fix leaking toilets, and “water-wise” your lawn.
