Garbage and Recycling collection changes February 1st

Republic Services will now collect garbage and recycling for residents and businesses

Swill begin collecting garbage and recycling in the city.

Many residents have already received a Republic welcome packet, or will by the middle of the month. The packet contains relevant information so customers can make a smooth transition. Here are some of the changes you can expect:

- Rates for most customers will remain as published in the 2016 Solid Waste Utility rates brochure. Some current Republic Services customers may experience a rate change based on their requested services.
- Organics and recycling collections are included in the rate. No extra charges are assessed.
- Garbage and recycling will be collected on an every-other-week schedule.
 Organics will be collected weekly.
- Republic Services will bill quarterly and maintain a customer service office at 212 Wells Ave S in Renton.
- Commercial customers will receive new grey garbage containers and blue recycling containers complete with instructional guides for "what goes where?"
- The city will continue to host the Spring and Fall Recycle Days for large recyclables and the Reuse It! Renton Stop & Swap Event. Additionally, the Waste Prevention & Recycling Education workshops and city-wide Litter Collection will continue.
