Enjoy Renton's Fabulous Fourth of July at Gene Coulon Memorial Beach Park, July 4

s July 4th approaches, we want to Aremind you that the use and sale of all fireworks has been prohibited inside Renton city limits since voters approved the ban in 2005. While the discharge of "safe and sane" fireworks may be permitted in some neighboring jurisdictions such as unincorporated King County including Skyway and Fairwood, and the City of Kent, all types of fireworks are prohibited in Renton. The City of Renton will actively enforce the ban and work together to confiscate all type of fireworks and issue citations. Violators will be subject to both civil and criminal citations and can be fined \$205. Additionally, the sale, possession or use of explosive devices such as M-80s, M-100s and homemade or modified fireworks is a felony offense and violators will face criminal charges.




