Several of our parks and trails will be renovated through a three-year, \$14.5 million project passed by the City Council; the Puget Sound Regional Council has allocated almost \$10 million for transportation improvements; a 4Culture grant was secured and will fund improvements at the Renton History Museum and Renton Civic Theatre; and Fire Station 15 in the Kennydale area is scheduled to open next month. Plus, the Family First Community Center, serving the Cascade/Benson Hill area, is moving towards being shovel-ready.

The balanced budget for 2019 and 2020 will allow us to continue to meet the needs of our community and provide the high level of customer service our residents have come to expect. I regularly receive compliments on the professionalism and compassion shown by our employees. Our staff takes great
