Proclamation

Whereas, in Washington State, 45% of women and 22% of men report having experienced sexual violence in their lifetime; and

Whereas, in King County, 7,152 adults and children received specialized assistance from organizations with programming for sexual assault victims in 2020; and

Whereas, rape is among the most underreported crimes for reasons that include victim's fear of being disbelieved or further traumatized within systems designed to support them; and additional barriers, such as language, immigration status, gender bias, and systemic racism further oppress and silence victims; and

Whereas, impacts of sexual violence are rooted in and compounded because Black, Indigenous and other people of color; people living in poverty; LGBTQ people; elders; people with disabilities and other people are targeted by oppression and affected by sexual violence in significant and complex ways; and

Whereas, statewide, 29% of the survivors who were supported by a community sexual assault organization identified as Black, Indigenous and people of color in 2019, and of those identifying ethnicity, 21% identified as Latinx/Hispanic; and

Whereas, King County is home to many organizations that provide culturally- and linguistically-specific services, which are critical in effectively responding to specific needs and barriers faced by survivors from various racial, ethnic, faith, and cultural communities; survivors who are immigrants and refugees; survivors who are LGBTQ; and survivors with disabilities; and

Whereas, negative impacts of sexual violence trauma on women, men, children and youth include fear, concern for safety, symptoms of post-traumatic stress disorder, injury, and missed work or school; and

Whereas, working together as a community, we can alleviate the trauma of sexual violence by ensuring supportive resources are available to all survivors, while standing up to harmful attitudes and behaviors that contribute to sexual assault;

Now, therefore, I, Armondo Pavone, Mayor of the City of Renton, do hereby proclaim April 2021, to be

Sexual Assault Awareness Month

in the City of Renton, and I encourage all residents to join advocates and communities throughout King County in taking action to prevent sexual violence by standing with survivors.
