Basic Kit Items

Aisle #'s

- Water** G56
(Minimum 3 gallons per person, plus more for pets)
- Ready-to-eat food** G11
(3 days of food for each person and pet. Ready-to-eat food requires no preparation or cooking to make it safe to eat. Canned, dried and other long-shelf-life foods are acceptable. Do not include foods that must be stored in the refrigerator or freeze before using. **DO** include infant formula or baby food if needed.)
- Manual can opener** B46
- Battery operated radio** N/A
- Flashlight** C11
- Extra batteries for radio and flashlight** ... F18
- Prescription or other essential medications or medical supplies** Pharmacy
(Minimum of 3 extra days supply)
- Blankets** (or sleeping bags) E21
- Sleeping Bags** (or blankets) E21
- Basic First Aid Kit Supplies** A16
A ready-made first aid kit should include these basics or assemble them yourself:
 - ◇ Bandages A16
 - ◇ Gauze pads A16
 - ◇ Roller Gauze A16
 - ◇ Adhesive Tape A16
 - ◇ Scissors A16
 - ◇ Tweezers A16
 - ◇ Soap, antibiotic, or antiseptic A16
 - ◇ Moistened towelettes A16
 - ◇ Antiseptic spray A16
 - ◇ Thermometer A16
 - ◇ Vinyl gloves A16

- Fire Extinguisher** C11
- Large plastic trash bags** A52
- Toilet Paper** A51
- Personal Hygiene Items** A24, A26
(Examples of hygiene items: toothpaste/toothbrush, hair and skin care, feminine hygiene, diapers, baby wipes.)
- Waterproof matches or lighter** E29
- Duct Tape** C15
- Plastic Sheeting (4-6 mil thickness)** C15
(enough to cover windows and doors in one room)
- Paper or notebook** B19
- Pencil or Pen** B21
- Local Map** N/A

Optional Items

Aisle #'s

- NOAA Weather Radio with S.A.M.E. programming N/A
- Wrench to shut off utilities C13
- Disposable plates, cups, utensils A51
- Folding campstove with “canned heat” - alcohol gel fuel E25, E29
(regular campstoves are NOT safe to use indoors)
- Heavy work gloves C13
- Sun block A49
- Insect Repellent F52
- Backpack to carry supplies with you or F60
- Plastic storage tub for fixed storage of supplies C2, C3
- Tent E31
- Rope N/A
- Folding camp shovel E29
- Compass E29
- Hand-crank operated cell phone charger N/A
- Toys, games, books to pass the time E1—E24

IMPORTANT ITEMS TO ADD TO YOUR KIT AFTER YOU GO HOME (no purchase needed)

- One full change of clothing for each person
- Emergency contact numbers including at least one outside of the local dialing area
- Leash or carrier for pets
- Credit cards
- Small amount of cash
- Cell phone fully charged, plus extra battery
- Copies of important papers in waterproof container
 - ◇ Insurance records
 - ◇ Medical records for people and pets
 - ◇ Bank account numbers
 - ◇ Social Security card
 - ◇ Individual identification papers
- Watch or battery operated clock
