



Update: Crews speed up paving work on SR 169

Expect overnight lane closures in Renton, August 4-6 and August 11-13

PROJECT BACKGROUND

The Washington State Department of Transportation is repaving nearly 2 miles of State Route 169 from 140th Avenue Southeast to Blaine Drive to remove cracks, wheel ruts and potholes on the more than 20-year-old pavement. Contractor crews are also improving 15 sidewalk ramps to create a smoother transition from the sidewalk to the street.

ADJUSTED HOURS TO SPEED UP PAVING

WSDOT contractor crews will work Friday and Saturday nights during two weekends in August to reduce the number of nights needed for paving from 20 to five.

OVERNIGHT TRAVEL DELAYS ON SR 169

Drivers should expect overnight lane closures and alternating traffic during the weekends of August 4-6 and August 11-13.

- Lane reductions will start at 8 p.m. Friday and Saturday nights.
- All lanes of SR 169 will open no later than 10 a.m. Saturday and Sunday mornings.
- Drivers should expect travel delays of 30 minutes and use alternate routes if possible.

DAYTIME AND NIGHTTIME WORK

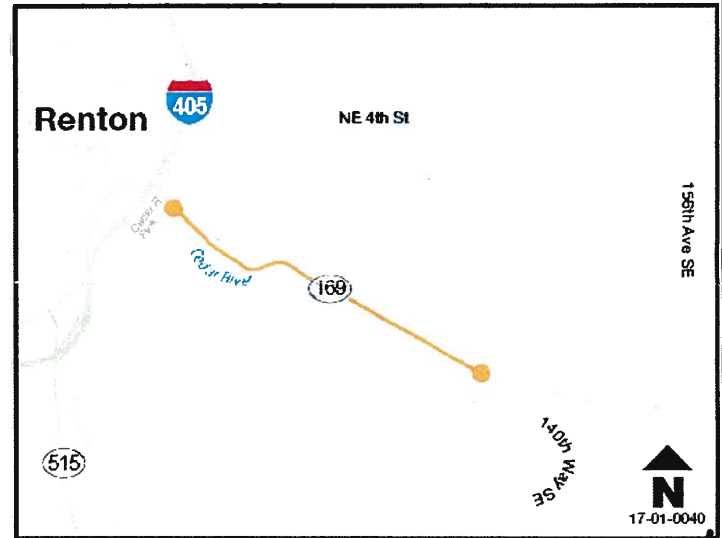
Crews will work day and night during the project. Work to replace the sidewalk ramps will occur during the day while repairs and paving will occur at night. Nighttime work includes roadway repair, grinding the old pavement and repaving the nearly 2-mile section with asphalt.

NIGHTTIME WORK AND ITS IMPACT

Residents living the work zone along SR 169 will hear noise from construction equipment and vehicles, saw cutting of the concrete, grinding, paving, generators and backup alarms.
