



RENTON DOWNTOWN UTILITY IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

Utility Work in the Downtown Area

The Downtown Utility Improvements Project construction continues its work to upgrade water, sewer and stormwater infrastructure within the downtown core. We began utility improvements this past spring with a projected 24 month construction period. Current construction efforts are putting our completion ahead of schedule, with storm utility improvements now complete.

Remaining sewer utility work has reached 90% completion and will be completed this fall with low-impact, cured in-place lining happening through spring 2022.

Remaining work includes Water Utility Improvements **which will begin this fall and will go through spring of 2022**. Shown in the map to the right, are the remaining areas of work. Overall project construction is anticipated to be completed in Fall of 2022. See reverse side of mailer for a general project timeline.

We will promote business access and keep traffic moving to and through downtown during high impact work. Access to businesses and local events will be maintained, and directional signage and on-site crews will direct traffic. Work hours are 7 a.m. - 6 p.m. Additional notifications will be provided as work moves to specific areas and where detours and road closures may be needed. Please follow directions of flaggers and posted signage for safe access.



1. S 2nd St Sewer

October - November 2021

The ongoing sewer main installation has reached its last leg with the current work in S 2nd St. Work will continue from the low point at the intersection of Whitworth Ave S & S 2nd St, moving west to Rainier Ave S and east to Morris Ave S.

2. Water Utility

December 2021 - January 2022

Water utility work will begin later this year through early next year in the following locations:

- Whitworth Ave S and Shattuck Ave S, between S 2nd St and S 3rd St.
- Water utility work on S 2nd St from Whitworth Ave S to Rainier Ave S.
- Water utility work will occur south of S 3rd St at Whitworth Ave S and Smithers Ave S.

3. Rainier Ave S Sewer Access Lid

December 2021

We will return to the intersection of Rainier Ave S and S 3rd St to complete installation of a sewer access lid. Lanes will be restricted as needed, but through access of the intersection will be maintained.

Water Utility Wrap-up (not on map)

Late Fall 2021 - Early Winter 2022

Not shown in the map are final steps to complete water utility improvements such as installing final services, connections and pressure testing. Water utility shutoffs are anticipated during service connections. We will reach out with prior notifications prior to shutoffs.

Paving and Restoration (not on map)

Spring - Fall 2022

Final Paving and restoration of downtown curbs, sidewalks and roads will begin in the spring following completion of utility work.

Cured In-place Lining (not on map)

November 2021 - December 2021

Low-impact cured in place work to repair and reinforce existing utility infrastructure will occur throughout the project area.



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DUIP Project Timeline



The City of Renton hereby gives public notice that it is the Agency's policy to assure full compliance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Restoration Act of 1987, and related statutes and regulations in all programs and activities. Title VI requires that no person shall, on the grounds of race, color, sex, or national origin be excluded from the participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be otherwise subjected to discrimination under any Federal Aid Highway program or other activity for which the City of Renton receives federal financial assistance. Any person who believes they have been aggrieved by an unlawful discriminatory practice under Title VI has a right to file a formal complaint with the City of Renton. Any such complaint must be in writing and filed with the City of Renton Title VI Coordinator within one hundred, eighty (180) days following the date of the alleged discriminatory occurrence.
