



# RENTON DOWNTOWN UTILITY IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

## Underground Utility Improvements Ready for Repaving

The Downtown Utility Improvement Project (DUIP) construction has worked to upgrade water, sewer and stormwater infrastructure within the downtown core. The purpose of this work is to replace old infrastructure to meet current and future development needs in the downtown area, and is happening in advance of projects in the coming years that will improve intersections, replace signals and convert S 2nd St and S 3rd St to two-way operations.

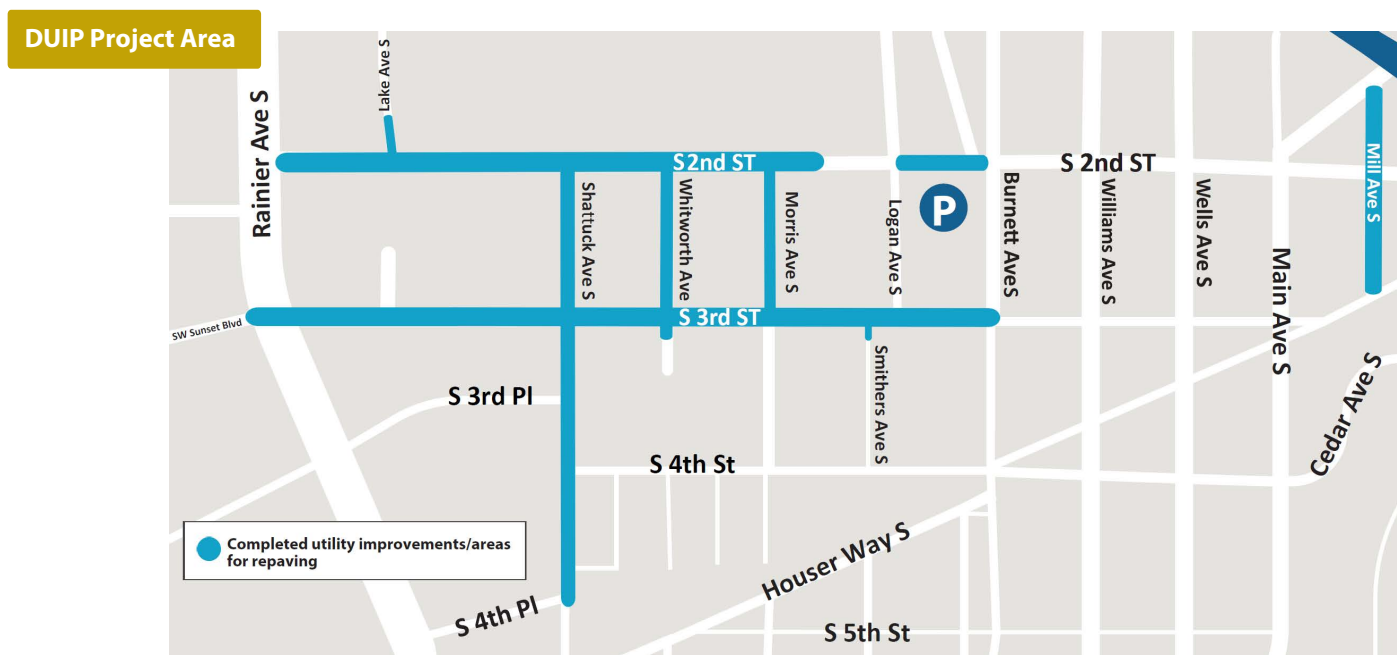
We began utility improvements in spring 2021 with a projected 24-month construction period. Efforts over the past year have put project completion ahead of schedule, and we now expect to be fully complete by early fall 2022. Following completion of storm utilities in summer 2021 and sewer utilities at the end of 2021, the DUIP is happy to announce completion of underground water utility work. This marks our final major utility improvement in the broad downtown project area, and the end to digging trenches and installing pipes.

### What is happening next?

Work will slow down as we prepare for repaving of the project area, anticipated this spring. Activity over the next month will include crews performing testing, tying in and activating the new water system, changing over services to the new lines and other utility wrap-up work. Repaving is the final major stage before the DUIP is complete. This work is anticipated to begin as early as late March and extend into early or late April depending on weather. Repaving will be followed by final restoration through late summer/early fall 2022. Final restoration activities will include raising manhole lids, installing valve covers, permanent road striping and other wrap-up tasks.

Repaving will occur in each of the areas where we improved underground utilities over the past year, replacing temporary roadway patches. Roads will be closed and restricted during work. Shown below is a project area map where repaving will occur. Access to downtown businesses will be maintained via S 4th St. Please follow posted signage for safe access.

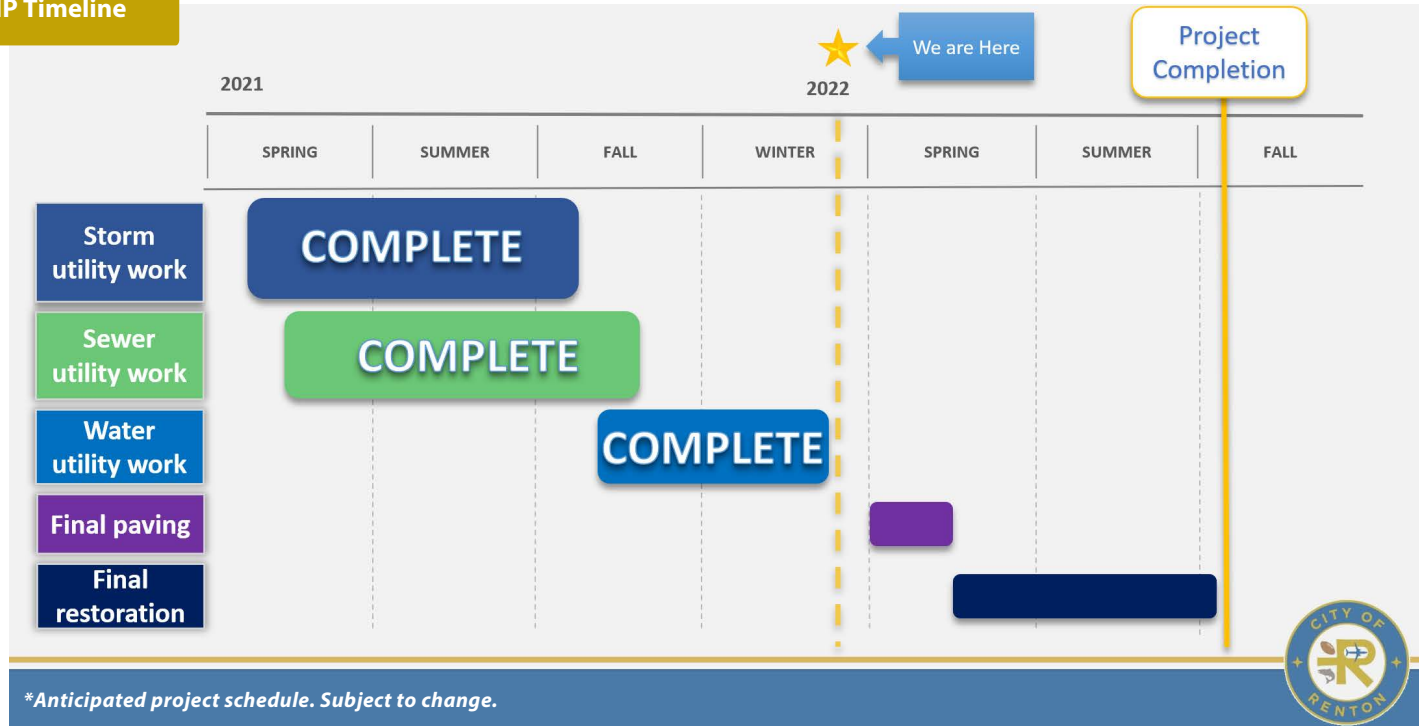

The City of Renton hereby gives public notice that it is the Agency's policy to assure full compliance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, the Civil Rights Restoration Act of 1987, and related statutes and regulations in all programs and activities. Title VI requires that no person shall, on the grounds of race, color, sex, or national origin be excluded from the participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be otherwise subjected to discrimination under any Federal Aid Highway program or other activity for which the City of Renton receives federal financial assistance.
