Renton History Museum starts the city's celebration of Black History Month by presenting *Global Heat* on February 9 at 1 p.m.

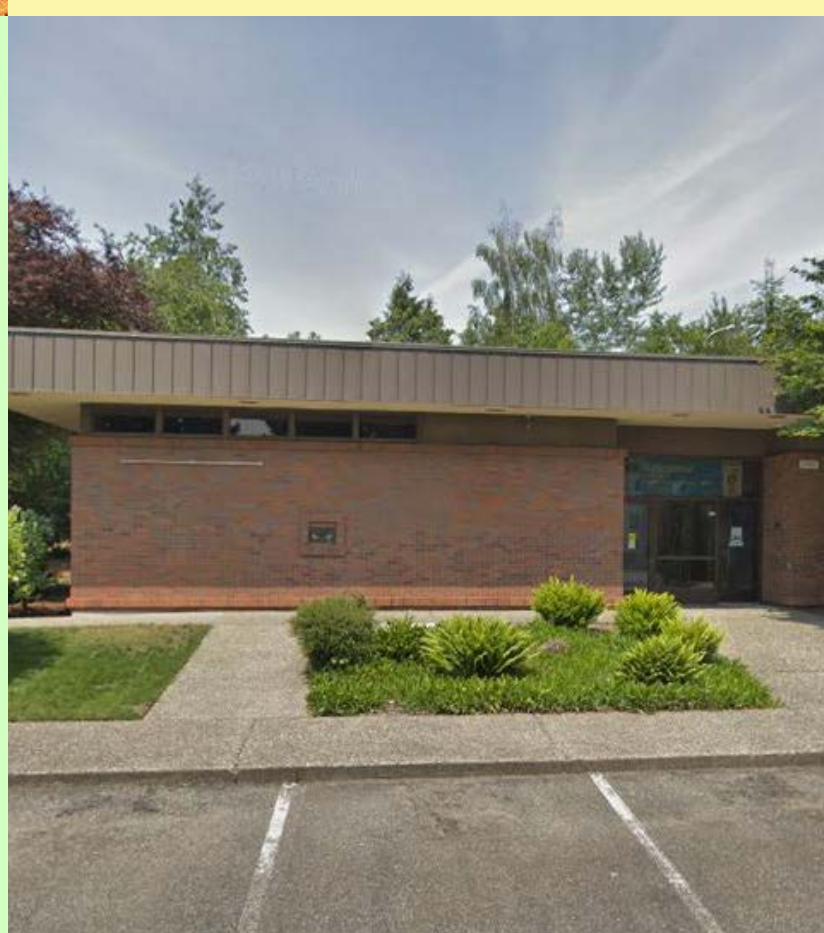
Other events include a virtual tour of the city's African-American sites (Feb. 21 & 26) and "Realizing the Dream: Justice for All" (Feb. 28)
