Plastic Bag Survey and Campaign



As many cities and countries around the world have recognized, plastic bags are a problem with financial and environmental impacts. Whether intentionally littered or not, plastic bags in the environment pollute our waters and endanger wildlife and humans. To reduce plastic bag use, the Solid Waste Utility is launching the Bring Your Own Bag campaign in April.

Bring reusable bags whenever you shop to help keep Renton a safe, healthy and enjoyable place for everyone. In addition, tell us how you feel about plastic bags by completing the plastic bag survey online by June 6th. Lastly, be a citizen scientist and help gather data by submitting photos of littered plastic bags in your neighborhood with the date and address, or nearest intersection, where the photo was taken. Latex Paint Recycling



King County residents and businesses can now drop off unwanted latex paint, water-based stains and clear finishes for recycling at designated locations, including Fairwood and Highlands Ace Hardware stores in Renton. A fee will be charged to cover the cost of labor to package and transport the latex paint to the processing

facility. Call the collection site for acceptability and recycling fee. Oil-based paint, solvents and other hazardous products are NOT accepted and should be <u>disposed of properly</u>.

If you recycle food scraps and yard waste by putting them in your curbside organics bin or in your own compost pile, we salute you. You rescue valuable resources from the landfill that can be turned into nutrient-rich compost for our

region to grow food and maintain healthy gardens.

To celebrate your phenomenal recycling efforts, Cedar Grove is bringing back Compost Days. From March 9 to April 22, it will offer discounts on soil and donate compost to important community projects, including Mother Joseph Farm at Providence Health & Services in Renton.
